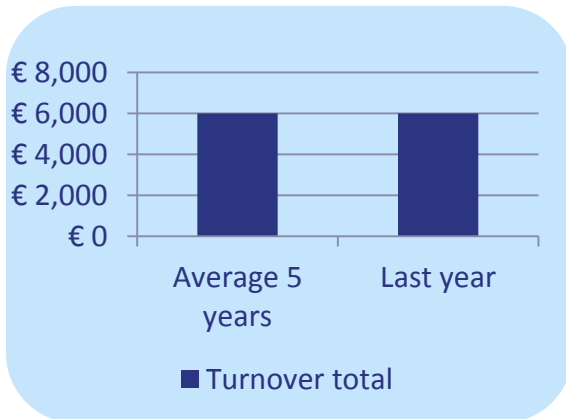

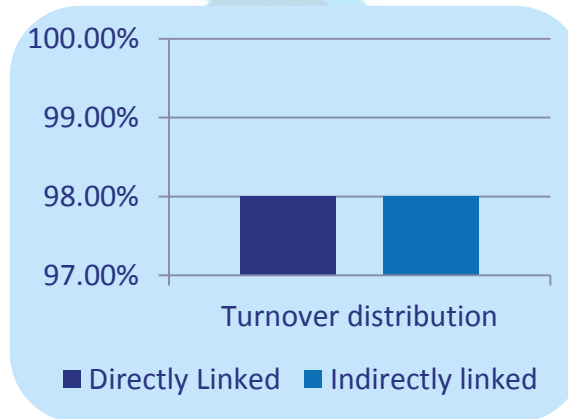
Success factor

“Open Data is an ‘ordinary’ resource for a company which needs to fit in a business model. For this reason no particular success factor can be identified for Open Data.”

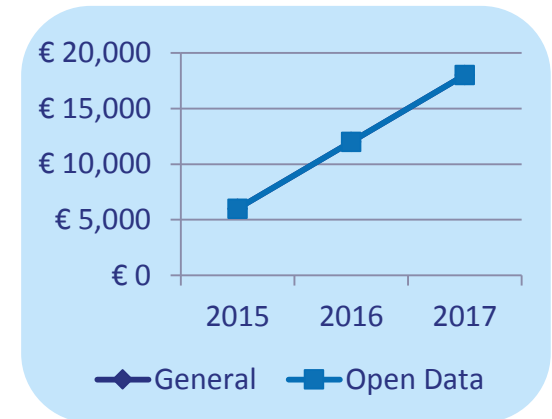
Turnover total
