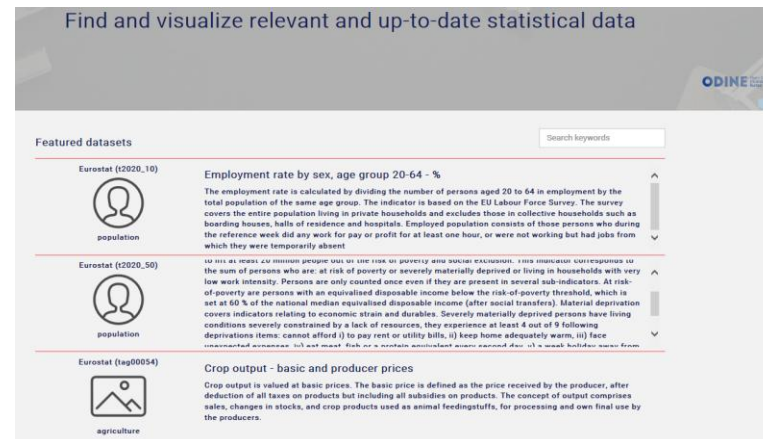

Eurostat (2020_10) **Employment rate by sex, age group 20-64 - %**
 population
 The employment rate is calculated by dividing the number of persons aged 20 to 64 in employment by the total population of the same age group. The indicator is based on the EU Labour Force Survey. The survey covers the entire population living in private households and excludes those in collective households such as boarding houses, halls of residence and hospitals. Employed population consists of those persons who during the reference week did any work for pay or profit for at least one hour, or were not working but had jobs from which they were temporarily absent.

Eurostat (2020_50) **At risk of poverty and severely materially deprived**
 population
 At risk of poverty are persons with an equivalised disposable income below the risk-of-poverty threshold, which is set at 60 % of the national median equivalised disposable income (after social transfers). Material deprivation covers indicators relating to economic strain and durables. Severely materially deprived persons have living conditions severely constrained by a lack of resources, they experience at least 4 out of 9 following deprivations (items: cannot afford i) to pay rent or utility bills, ii) keep home adequately warm, iii) face unexpected expenses, iv) eat meat, fish or a number equivalent once a week, v) eat a meat substitute more than once a week, vi) eat less than one meat substitute once a week, vii) eat less than one meat substitute once a week, viii) eat less than one meat substitute once a week, ix) eat less than one meat substitute once a week).

Eurostat (tag00054) **Crop output - basic and producer prices**
 agriculture
 Crop output is valued at basic prices. The basic price is defined as the price received by the producer, after deduction of all taxes on products but including all subsidies on products. The concept of output comprises sales, changes in stocks, and crop products used as animal feedingsuffs, for processing and own final use by the producers.
